Something to Think About...

The events of the last week of January have been quite impactful on our community. Even if you were one of the lucky early ones to get back utilities quickly and were blessed with minimal damage from the ice and falling tree limbs, God cut through the noise of our routines or tried to if we gave Him the chance. Our modern world is very much at odds and conflict with the spiritual disciplines of slowing and meditation. Many of us found ourselves with plenty of opportunities for slowing and meditative quiet time (although it was a bit cold).

We are reminded in **James 1:2-4** that we should find joy when trials come up in life as it produces steadfastness or patience in other translations. Many times during those trials we are tempted to run short of patience and let our irritation boil over. This is why James later comes to the statement that “faith without works is dead.” We can say that we are a patient follower of Christ but when circumstances and events in our life push us to our limits while facing suffering do we have the works that back up our vocalized faith.

However, the purpose of my article here is not to beat up on folks when they are down but to instead encourage some self-reflection on how recent events have reflected our character. As a community we have seen many bright spots come out of this storm’s aftermath. Many of us have put foot to faith by checking in on our neighbors and community and putting their needs ahead of our own. We will be having the great opportunity in the coming weeks to grow our own little worlds in ministry to others even in the midst of our own suffering. With many Southern Baptist Disaster Relief boots on the ground to help us with the heavy lifting of ministry in these hard days, we also have the chance to care and minister to the caregivers. James ends that aforementioned section by saying “patience must do its complete work, so that you may be mature and complete, lacking nothing.” Oh that that would be said of our community by those partnering with us in ministry over these first weeks of February.
