Something to Think About...

"This is the true story of ... strangers picked to live in a house, [and] work together \dots – to find out what happens when people stop being polite and start getting real."

-abridged intro narration from MTV's The Real World 1992-2017

Those were the opening words to the longest-running program in MTV history, one of the longest-running reality series in history, and a series that is credited with launching the modern reality TV genre. This is by no means an endorsement as I do not in any way encourage consumption of this entertainment "junk food". However, one can't help but wonder as restrictions get loosened and pockets of life get back to a semblance of normal if the people that make up our churches, communities, and world have not taken on some of that last part of the intro lines "what happens when people stop being polite and start getting real" ?

With the shortened fuses of most at an all time low and the calcified encrusted hearts of most with a love grown rather cold, there is concern about how we choose to interact and engage with one another from day to day.

"If we say we have fellowship with Him while we walk in darkness, we lie and do not practice the truth. But if we walk in the light, as He is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus his Son cleanses us from all sin."

-1 John 1:6-7 (ESV)

Our default unregenerate "reality" or "being real" is that we are "the sexually immoral, … idolaters, … adulterers, … practic[ioners of] homosexuality, … thieves, … the greedy, … drunkards, … revilers, … swindlers" (1 Cor. 9-11). When that is where we find ourselves defaulting to after unloading from the stress of recent days, it might be time for a spiritual check-up. The passage in first John refers to "walk[ing] in darkness". It is one thing to walk and occasionally have a shadow cross or obscure your path. It is another thing entirely to choose to walk in the concealment of shadow by choice or find your path through dark alleyways.

When it comes down to it, we could all do with a little more pre-pandemic politeness motivated out of a grateful heart for Christ's loving sacrifice as we approach the lead up to Resurrection Sunday.
