March, the month named after the mythological Roman god of war, very much befits its name as a time of tumultuous turbulence. Falling into the transitional period of winter moving to spring, the lingering cold air and onset of warmer temps leads to strong winds as air masses collide in their own skirmishes and battles. This time has been so associated with such upheaval that it even garnered the phrase "in like a lion, out like a lamb".

Last year in this newsletter column, I wrote about one of my favorite aspects of this month in the St. Patrick's day holiday. So as I started to think about what to write about this year, I found myself tormented with the tyranny of the blank page. That blank page or empty canvas or clean slate is a lot like the month of March. The earth has been wiped clean of the previous year's growth and foliage (another reason for the strong winds) and the last of that winter chill and weather is making its way out. Reminds me of the opening lines of Josh Baldwin's song "Evidence":

All throughout my history Your faithfulness has walked beside me

The winter storms made way for spring In every season, from where I'm standing

Interestingly enough, the lynchpin dead in the center of this month happens to be a Sunday falling on the 16th. The mathematical median of March ends up with the date 3/16. NAMB sent out a call for churches to use this opportunity to focus on the heart core "Gospel in a nutshell" that we find in John 3:16. Once upon a time, this was the most easily and readily recognized verse in all of scripture. However, in recent months, I have seen our society primarily think the gospel is primarily doing good works and deeds of compassion (those works and deeds typically being defined with a particular political slant or motivation). Jesus did not come to make a political or social revolution or to show us how to have a better world and society. Jesus came to provide the opportunity for a clean slate with God through his sacrifice on the cross driven by His love for us. Death once and for all to provide for new and abundant eternal life.

May the winds of March remind us of all the things that wind symbolizes in scripture. Jesus' departure to the Father opened the door for the blessed Holy Spirit to dwell amongst and within each of us that believe. Jesus showed God's power over nature on the stormy seas so that we could know that no matter how strong, there is nothing greater than our God! It also reminds us that "It is a fearful thing to fall into the hands of the living God" -Heb. 10:31 and the seriousness of divine judgment that will be swift and complete. Jesus, unlike March, came in like a lamb but will one day return as a LION!
