### Something to Think About...

As I write this, two high school sports are taking off with regards to the school year. They are football and cross country. Both are exciting to me for different reasons this time of year. While many times "football is king" around our area, I think we can take some definite guidance from the TEAM nature of both aforementioned sports.

Football is pretty obvious as you need your full complement of players to play (and preferably a deep enough squad that you can change out players for different aspects of the game). While there are numerous individual coaches, the final responsibility lands on the shoulders of the head coach. Individual players can hit the weight room or the track to improve their athletic ability in general for the aspects of the game they will need that strength and/or speed. But ultimately, the head coach comes up with a cohesive strategy and plan that incorporates the accumulated strengths and abilities the team has while trying to limit exposure of their weaknesses to the opposition.

Cross Country as a team sport is scored a lot like golf in that the lowest team score wins. Individual team members account for points based on what place they come in as far as overall so first place would only accumulate 1 point for your team, while fourth place would net 4 points for the team. A team is composed of roughly 7 members and the places of all are included to make up the team's final score. In cross-country, an individual team member can also work to improve their athletic ability so that they can put forth their best effort. The coach is there to come up with an overall strategy for how the individual elements of the team can run their best paces and key off of one another to achieve the best team result.

Both sports have a team effort led by a coach in terms of the big picture while there is important responsibility for each individual team member to take a hearty self-assessment to be the best athlete they can be to fit their particular role.
